

JUNE

Join us for a Thrilling Kickoff to the Polo Season

The 2025 season launches in spectacular fashion with the Opening Day match on June 7, featuring USA vs. Morocco. Morocco last traveled to Newport in 2018, making this a long-awaited return as they seek to take the lead in the tied rivalry. This marks the first major international face-off, setting the stage for the highly competitive 2025 season. The month of June continues with the prestigious Veuve Clicquot Cup on June 14, followed by another long-anticipated clash - USA vs. Scotland on June 21. Closing out the month, Newport vs. Boston on June 28 brings an epic showdown between two historic rivals, where pride, power, and pure grit collide in an electrifying battle for New England supremacy.

International Showdowns and Fierce Competition

July ignites with a star-spangled spectacle as we carry the Independence Day revelry into **Saturday**, **July 5 for USA vs. Italy** in a battle of European finesse and American fortitude. Expect a match that embodies sharp strategy, meticulous planning, and a contest for favor with Rhode Island's deep Italian roots.

The energy intensifies on July 12, as Newport battles Pittsburgh, a matchup that demands endurance, strategy, and precision for a showdown promising fast-paced action and dramatic plays in a thrilling duel that will keep spectators on the edge of their seats.



July 19 brings a fan-favorite standoff with USA vs. Ireland, known for their fearless determination and dynamic teamwork, yielding a thrilling annual rematch.

The month reaches an electrifying conclusion with the **Governor's Cup on July 26**, where Rhode Island's own **Governor McKee** will toss the coin to set ablaze a match steeped in prestige and high-stakes competition.

AUGUST

Mid-month, the highly anticipated USA vs. Jamaica match on August 16 takes center stage. Expect an explosion of energy as these two powerhouse teams go head-to-head, bringing bold, fast-paced play and plenty of dramatic moments. Then, on August 23, it's a battle for regional pride as Newport clashes with New York, a rivalry that always delivers thrilling action.

The month culminates on August 30, as USA squares off against England, reigniting an age-old transatlantic polo rivalry that combines elegance, strategy, and breathtaking skill. This is more than just a match—it's a spectacle, a celebration of heritage, and a true test of sportsmanship.



SEPTEMBER

Finally, the Turkish Airlines Finals on September 27 will be the season's climactic finale, ensuring that the last match of the year is one to remember, one last chance to enjoy the signature polo experience, from quintessential picnics to double-decker spectating, closing out the season with a bang.







2024 Player Spotlight: Touba Ghadessi

For six years, polo has been a journey of self-discovery. discipline, and community. A lifelong equestrian with a dressage background. Touba had found solace in riding, but a demanding academic career left little time for it. That changed when her husband surprised her with a Newport Polo match and lesson. Instantly, the magic of polo reignited her passion.

The Newport Polo community has been a pillar of support, from her first practices to competing in the first women's tournament. Mentors like Minnie Keating have shaped Touba's approach, combining skill, strategy, and camaraderie. Off the field, her husband JR remains her biggest cheerleader, making polo a cherished family affair with their daughter, Ava also playing.

The centuries-old traditions of the sport blends meditation in practice with electrifying competition. On the field, titles disappear-only skill and teamwork matter.

Balancing polo with her role as Chief Academic Officer at RISD requires planning. But the reward for scheduling time for polo is a vital outlet that restores focus, making her more effective in her profession.

Training is rigorous. A disciplined lifestyle for an athlete keeps her in peak form. Mental preparation is key, with pre-game strategy talks and mid-game adaptability essential. Minnie's advice to embrace change and communicate has been transformative.





Every sport has its unexpected challenges to rise above. Losses have been valuable teachers, shaping resilience and deepening Touba's appreciation for the game. Self-doubt surfaced in the Governor's Cup when she felt outmatched. Focusing on teamwork over perfection ultimately contributed to a win.

Sportsmanship and competition are equally valued. As Dan Keating says, polo is like chess—anticipation and composure

Touba's goals have shifted from personal success to team synergy. A great player, she has learned, is a great teammate. To newcomers, her advice is simple: embrace the process, trust the team, and savor the moments when everything clicks—because when it does, nothing compares.



Stemming from a collaboration between the Newport and Middletown Rotary clubs, the Island Youth Interact Club is allowing younger generations the opportunity to leave a lasting impact on Aquidneck Island through acts of service.

The Interact Club, an international organization that was founded in 1962, has more than 200,000 members worldwide. The local chapter was formed in 2023 in partnership with the Newport County YMCA and is composed of five Middletown middle and high school students who have a passion for helping others and believe in the club's motto, "Service Above Self."

"This year, the club has been a true force for good, organizing local cleanups, and lending critical support to the Thanksgiving coat drive that helped keep so many in our community warm" - Cori Kilzi, associate executive director of the Newport County YMCA.

The club held its second annual coat drive last fall, where they collected more than 300 new and gently used coats to donate to homeless shelters, schools and the local mental health center.

The new coats were then raffled off in December at the Lucy's Hearth Christmas party, a joint effort between the Island Youth Interact Club and the Middletown Rotary Club to spread holiday cheer to the families of Lucy's Hearth. Filled with crafts, caroling, food and the winter coat raffle, the event served as a testament of their devotion to the community.

The club shifted in the spring, focusing on environmental stewardship. Last year, students organized the club's first Island Youth Earth Day Cleanup. Hosted at Gaudet Middle School, students were responsible for deciding on a location and logistics, promoting the event and collecting litter. Additionally, they partnered with the Middletown Tree Commission for a tree seedling giveaway, encouraging the planting of trees around the island and environmental sustainability. These events help ensure the important message of preserving the planet among their peers.

When students saw the news of the raging Los Angeles wildfires earlier this year, they knew they needed to help. They held

POLO PONY SPOTLIGHT

The Legend of Tarzan

Some polo ponies earn their reputation over time, quietly proving their worth, match after match. Others burst onto the scene with a presence so undeniable that their legend begins the moment their hooves hit the turf. Tarzan, the chestnut Thoroughbred with a spirit as wild as his namesake, is one of the latter.

Born in 2009 and bred for speed on the Suffolk Downs racetrack in Massachusetts, Tarzan's transition from racehorse to polo pony was anything but ordinary. When Newport Polo first acquired him in 2013, he made an entrance worthy of the king of the jungle. Breaking loose upon arrival at the farm, he galloped through the paddocks, rising onto his

hind legs and pounding his chest with his front hooves, whinnying his arrival for all the mares and fillies to take notice. It was a spectacle, a declaration—Tarzan had arrived.

With the perfect conformation for polo—compact, strong legs, a short back, and a naturally rounded head carriage—Tarzan had all the physical makings of a champion. But his mind and heart set him apart. The two years following his arrival were dedicated to patient training, transitioning from flatwork to mallet work, refining his natural power into controlled precision.

Tarzan became the Swiss Army knife of the Newport Polo string, adaptable and invaluable. Whether galloping in international matches, competitive tournaments, or bolstering the ranks of the Brown University and Newport interscholastic teams, he was a favorite mount for professional players and advanced riders. His speed, responsiveness, and revved-up nature demanded skillful hands, but those who mastered him found themselves aboard an equine powerhouse.

Always the social butterfly, Tarzan charmed both riders and fellow horses alike. In ride-offs, he seized the opportunity for flirtation, greeting his equine competitors with an affectionate breath into their nostrils. Even the youngest riders adored him, drawn to his sweet nature and playful personality. Off the field, he was equally endearing—sporting rare wavy locks in the off-season, striking his feed bucket with precise instruction at mealtimes, and occasionally surprising himself with an unexpected spook at his own flatulence.

Through the years, Tarzan has cemented his place in Newport Polo lore, earning Best Playing Pony honors from the Irish (2022), the English (2018), and most recently the Dominicans (2024). His legacy isn't just in the trophies or accolades but in the hearts of those who have had the privilege to ride him. From a fiery racehorse to a celebrated polo mount. Tarzan continues to rule the polo jungle with speed, spirit, and a touch of mischiefjust as a legend should.

Projects aimed at helping children and supporting talented youth have always been a priority.



By renewing initiatives of artistic wall painting in children's and adult hospitals and various art therapy gatherings, the Rotary Clubs have supported patients and made their lives brighter. Providing some hospitals with equipment has led to a qualitative improvement in their provision of medical services. They live in plundered villages and towns with destroyed infrastructure and almost without public transportation. Furthermore, there is a severe fuel deficit caused by the destroyed petrol stations, oil refineries and warehouses. To assist these people the Rotary clubs accepted bicycles donated from European Rotary clubs and restored them and donated them to people in the affected villages so they can go shopping for food and medicine. The bicycles are also used by workers to get to their jobs and postmen even use them to deliver packages and letters.

The Rotary Club of Kyiv Central–Sofia has organized a leadership course taught by Rotarians for teenage girls from Ispin and Bucha. Together with providing a safe space to hold the workshops they have included topics on goal setting, time management and team work.

A Spectator's Guide to Polo

Polo Player

Players are rated from -1 to 10 goals, from a beginner to ten goals being the best in the world.

Helmet

Hard surface, lined and strapped.
The helmet provides its wearer
maximum protection against
spills and swinging mallets,
per regulation standards.

Mallet

Bamboo cane with a hardwood beveled head to allow for a full swing flush to the ground. The 48"-54" shaft is highly flexible and can make a complete arc under the pony's neck or tail when swung hard.

Polo Breeches

Regulation White - double seated, traditional and functional for polo.

Knee Pads

Protects player's knees from bumps, balls and mallets.

Polo Boot

Provides protection for player's lower leg.

Man, Line,

Polo Pony

Full size horse that may be a thoroughbred/part quarterhorse or Argentine criollo. Selected for agility, speed, endurance and intelligence.

Clipped Mane and Braided Tail

Avoids interference with reins and mallets.

Draw Reins

Pulley design from head to girth allows the player more control in steering the pony.

Bridle

This series of strapping and supports give the player the ability to steer and stop the pony.

Polo Martingale

Used to inhibit the horse's head from raising up and hitting the rider.

Breast Plate

Secures the saddle forward.

Polo Saddle

Leather construction with stirrups. Differs from jumping saddle which has etra pads and from western saddle's horn mount.

Bandages

Protective wraps used for support.

Under the Neck

Polo is, without doubt the *oldest ball game in the world* today.

Polo, since 600 b.c. First recorded in the 6th century b.c. when the Turkomans beat the Persians in a diplomatic tournament, the alluring game caught on with royalty and cavalry, then took off with globalization, withstanding the test of time. Experience the king of games in its American landing, Newport! For players, polo is as tactical as chess and likened to hockey on horseback. There is a definite strategy with fast plays to advance the ball toward goal, and it is intensely physical to maneuver a thousand-pound thoroughbred downfield while striking a small plastic ball with adept stickhandling, against the opponent's preemptive defensives. For spectators, polo is an exciting athletic display and entertaining social experience outdoors in a manicured park-like setting. Polo's Gilded Age legacy as a premier sport in Newport has held over as one of the world's most unique international hubs for the sport, but the finer points of the game remain wrapped in an enigma to the uninitiated. This brief synopsis of the basics of a polo match may help!

STRATEGY • Man and horse work in partnership to get the ball through the opponent's goal, while defending and maneuvering to prevent the opposing side from scoring. Each player has a role on the attack, as well as when on the defensive, determined by their jersey number. The team's strategy will include how to subdue their opponent's strengths, by devising the most effective matchup against each player on the opposing side.

TEAMS • There are 4 players on each team. Each team's players are numbered 1-4, which designates what position the player will take on the field. Polo is one of the few sports where men and women play together at the highest levels. Teams are equalized by the players' cumulative handicaps.

CHUKKER • A chukker is a period of play in polo, usually 7 minutes and 30 seconds in duration. A top caliber polo match will have 6 chukkers. Between chukkers, players take several minutes to change horses.

DIVOT STOMP • At halftime, the announcer will invite the audience to participate in the time-honored tradition of 'treading-in' to repair the field by replacing the divots of grass uprooted by thundering hooves...stomping the divots, as it has become known. Even the Queen of England treads-in. It's a great time to stretch your legs (with beverage in hand if you're so inclined), toss a frisbee, and mingle.

THROW IN • The ball is put in play with a throw-in by 1 of 2 mounted umpires, at center-field at the start of the match and after each goal. At the beginning of each subsequent chukker, the throw in takes place at the spot on the field where play ended in the previous chukker.

DIRECTION OF PLAY • Teams change direction after every goal. Confusing, though it is, the purpose is to neutralize any advantage in playing conditions such as sun, wind and field conditions. It does from time to time, become confusing for the players as well.

RULES • Polo is governed by the United States Polo Association. Most of the rules are in place for the safety of the horses and players. Notable is that players may only use the mallet righthanded. The most important rule is #18, the team with the most goals wins (yes, that is really published in the official U.S Polo Association rulebook).

LINE OF THE BALL • Line of the ball is the basis for most rules in polo. The players follow an imaginary line, or right of way, created when the ball is struck by a player or it bounces off of an object on the field. Like a car on a highway, the player following the line of the ball has the right of way, and other players must yield to merge safely onto a lane on either side of the line.

FOULS • When you hear the umpire blow the whistle, it is to stop the play and the clock, usually due to a rule violation, which will result in a penalty hit awarded to the fouled team. Penalty hits often convert to goals, and can account for up to 40% of a team's score.

RIDE OFF • A primary defensive move. Two competitors and their horses make contact, side by side at equal speed, to push each other off the line of the ball or away from the play.

HOOK • A primary defensive move. A defender will use the mallet to hook or hit an opposing player's mallet as it attempts to strike the ball, to prevent the intended shot.

FIELD • A regulation polo field is 300 yards long by 160 yards wide (9 times the size of a football field). On the back line at each end are goal posts, 24 feet apart. Points are scored by hitting the ball between the posts.



A TAPESTRY OF TIME

The *History*

Glen Farm was first settled by colonists in 1638 when Ann Hutchinson and her followers broke away from Puritan Boston and founded Portsmouth for universal religious tolerance some 18 years after the pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock. The accessibility of fresh water running through the glen and the beachhead for a ferry crossing to the mainland made the site an attractive settlement. Friendly native Narragansetts sold them parcels of land for permanent homes and self-sustaining farms.

Over the next two centuries, Newport evolved into a summer resort for the barons of the industrial revolution and their heirs, whose leisure pursuits during the Gilded Age of the 1800's gave rise to many sporting traditions, including America's first polo club, while others like NY banking heir Henry A.C. Taylor, sought out country seats for a gentleman's farm.

Taylor purchased colonial farm parcels in Portsmouth to assemble the 700-acre Glen Farm in 1882, naming it after the property's most well-known feature, the glen, whose fresh water stream fueled a gristmill dating back to colonial times. Taylor's gentleman's farm became a self-sustained model in farm production, nationally reputed for blue ribbon livestock, innovative breeding and dairy production, and unsurpassed standards for quality. Glen Farm became a landmark of excellence, and unforeseen, the future home of polo in the next century. The farm turned out its own produce, water supply, electricity from a generator supplied by the mill in the glen and had its own fire engine and telephone system. There was also a wagon shed, tool house, blacksmith shop, icehouse, pottery shed, animal hospital and pump house. Taylor commissioned leading architects of that era for the creation of the classic stone and wood frame barns and stable complex, and the crowning glory was Taylor's summer residence, a magnificent French chateau manor house on the shore by John Russell Pope, replicating the Petit Trianon at Versailles, and landscape design by Frederick Law Olmstead.

After Taylor's death, Glen Farm passed to a succession of his heirs, endured the Great Depression and was subjugated to selling off major parcels, during which the property was poorly maintained and eventually abandoned. The last of the Taylor lineage, Mason Phelps offered Glen Farm to the Town of Portsmouth for \$3.6 million in 1989.





and Rebirth of Glen Farm

After the town of Portsmouth purchased Glen Farm in 1989, the deteriorating property remained vacant, approaching its demise until 1990 when its miraculous rebirth began with a 25-year-old Boston renovator named Dan Keating who signed a ten-year lease with the Town to rehabilitate Glen Farm and reincarnate the international polo tradition in its American birthplace. Keating's vision would restore Glen Farm's luster and status as the jewel of the community.

Not a pane of glass remained in place, nor a door on its hinges. The severely derelict property needed entirely new mechanical systems including plumbing, electrical, heating and fire alarms. In addition, Keating made wholesale repairs to the barn interiors, while improving the grounds with the addition of the exhibition polo field, soil and water conservation projects and the paddock system. In the renovation process, Keating's attention to detail included recasting solid brass hardware to match original pieces throughout the barns & stables that had been vandalized. Over the course of his lease, Keating personally invested over \$600,000, on top of rent and regular maintenance expenses, into restoring the farm into a thriving equestrian operation and landmark of excellence.

Keating revived the historic Polo Club, began a Polo Lesson program and launched the Newport International Polo Series, which is currently in its 34th season, offering public exhibition matches every Saturday from June through September, hosting teams from around the world including thirty–five nations from all six continents to date, attracting tens of thousands of spectators and supporting many civic and charitable causes with more than \$2.2 million in contributions.
